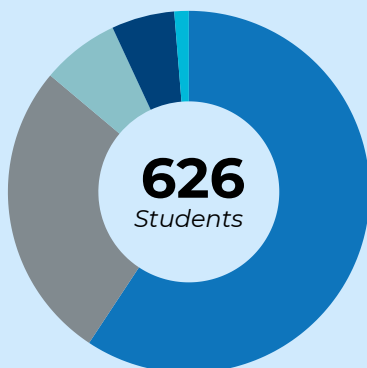

Current Funding Priorities

Student & Family Support Services

The CUES Schools initiated the Student & Family Services program in 2018 to help connect families to community resources, assisting with food and housing insecurities, as well as addressing other urgent needs a family may be experiencing.

LIFT with Boys Town

LIFT with Boys Town is a community-based, multi-tiered, multi-component, prevention intervention system. The goal of this program is to intervene before problems reach a level where children are unsafe, not at school, and the school community is not thriving.

Mental Health Therapy

The CUES School System provides overall counseling services to the students and families at all of our schools. The focus is to enhance students mental health and support academic performance with a foundation in our faith.
