





Our Academics

Our classrooms are seeing measurable progress. 65% of students improved in reading (3% growth from previous school year), and 59.3% improved in math (3.3% growth from previous year). Every percentage point reflects hours of practice, questions asked, and revision that builds skill—supported by teachers' clear goals, high expectations, and caring, targeted teaching.

STEAM

CUES students now have access to STEAM education at their schools, bringing hands-on science, technology, engineering, art, and math to every campus and strengthening our holistic model.

STEAM connects learning to life. Students investigate real problems, test ideas, and build and create through design thinking, robotics basics, digital media, and tools like 3D printers. They work in a hands-on structure that invites curiosity and persistence while strengthening problem-solving, collaboration, and communication—and they apply reading and math in real-world projects that make skills concrete and memorable.

For CUES students, STEAM also widens horizons. By seeing how technology and creativity work together, they develop career awareness—from healthcare and construction to energy, design, and tech—so each student can recognize pathways that match their interests and strengths. The result is confidence, belonging, and measurable growth grounded in authentic practice. It's learning that reduces barriers and opens pathways—where potential meets opportunity.



LIFT with Boys Town



At CUES, our model begins with the whole family, and students thrive when schools coordinate with the adults who shape their daily lives. That's why the CUES School System partners with Boys Town's LIFT program to address behavioral challenges with care and expertise.

Through LIFT, licensed professionals provide prevention and early identification, evidence-based counseling, teacher trainings, in-home family services, and parent education. Support is coordinated with caregivers so strategies used at school carry over at home, strengthening consistency and trust.

When behaviors require a response, we prioritize restorative practices over punitive discipline, repairing relationships, teaching skills that last, and keeping students connected to learning. At CUES, no student falls through the cracks: every child has access to the academic, social, emotional, and wraparound services they need to succeed.

Mental Health Therapy

CUES students and families have access to counseling and therapy at all three schools—All Saints, Holy Name, and Sacred Heart. This support enhances students' mental health, sustains their academic progress, and equips them with lifelong tools to care for their well-being.

When mental health needs are addressed, students focus, participate, and learn. Counseling helps stabilize attendance, strengthen self-regulation, and support the skills that lead to growth in reading, math, and beyond. The outcome we're working toward is clear: students who thrive academically and personally, and families who feel supported as their children grow into strong, caring leaders in our community.





Student & Family Support Services

Our model begins with the whole family. Because many obstacles lie beyond the classroom, CUES invests in family case management that meets each household with dignity and practical support. The CUES School System launched the Student and Family Support Services Program in 2018 to connect families with concrete resources: benefits enrollment, financial coaching, housing and utility assistance, transportation, legal assistance, and trusted health partners.

Working alongside caregivers, our staff builds actionable plans and coordinates services so students can arrive ready to learn. We stay in regular communication with the adults who shape each child's daily life, helping to solve problems early and reduce barriers that interrupt learning.

Support doesn't end at graduation. We stay in touch through high school and college/trade school, offering guidance and referrals as students navigate new systems and set long-term goals. The result is not only academic progress, but the formation of strong, caring leaders who contribute to their families and our community.

We're excited and proud to celebrate where our eighth-grade graduates are now. The CUES Class of 2025 is attending high school: 89% at private high schools, 9% at public high schools, and 2% homeschooled. Each path reflects students' hard work, family support, and the strong academic and wraparound foundation they built at CUES—confidence, belonging, and skills that carry them forward to thrive in what's next academically and personally.

And as they take flight, CUES helps nurture and connect their potential with opportunity so they can imagine a bright future, soar, and achieve. We're thrilled to see them enrolled in outstanding high schools. Even after they leave our nest, CUES stays close: celebrating wins, standing with them through challenges, and connecting them to the resources they need to succeed so they can fly even higher.



A Family's Path: From Dreams to Real Opportunity

When Oliva Pliego moved her family to North Omaha in 2012, she wondered if she'd made the right choice. Then she found Sacred Heart School and the CUES School System. In classrooms where rigorous academics meet a culture of belonging, her children flourished. Beyond the classroom, CUES built relationships with Oliva and her family—consistent check-ins, case management, and resources—so that support at school was reinforced at home.

Today, three of Oliva's children are in college, and her youngest is in 8th grade, preparing for high school. Oliva also graduated from the Financial Support Program & Financial Hope Collaborative, strengthening her family's financial stability and widening the runway for her children's goals. Now, she serves as the Kitchen Manager at Sacred Heart School, a role that reflects her commitment to the CUES community.

Fundraise: Host a fundraising event or peer-to-peer campaign to help underwrite the cost to educate a student.








CUES Education: Breaking Barriers to Learning
